Papal Prayer Intentions for December

Pope Leo's prayer intention for December is for Christians living amidst war or conflict, especially in the Middle East: This prayer is a way of saying to the Christians of Palestine, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, and so many other countries that they are not forgotten, that the universal Church walks with them; but also to remind us all that faith grows even in the midst of trials, and that seeds of reconciliation and peace can be born from wounded communities.


This month we are invited to join in Pope Leo's prayer intention

The Advent Wreath

Today we light the first of our Advent candles. Traditionally we will be lighting three purple candles and one pink candle. The purple candles represent the royalty of the coming King. The pink candle is the third candle to be lit on Gaudete Sunday and represents 'joy'. The gradual lighting of the four candles symbolises the coming light into the world. The wreath itself is also symbolic. The circle of evergreen in which the candles are placed represent everlasting life.

Gospel Reflection - In the Days of Noah





The hardest thing about living our lives is finding time to live our lives! Our days are ruled by the clock. Few of us can wake up and choose what to do. Our time is dictated by routine and before we know it life has passed us by before we've had time to live it. The biggest theme of Advent is 'change' but in the busy run up to Christmas, changing the way we live our lives is probably the last thing on our minds. We are much more likely to be comparing prices of the latest iPhone!

Today we are given the biggest life changing piece of advice that we could ever have. Preparation! Preparation is essential whether we are setting out to buy a new washing machine or setting out to change the world. Without preparation we will end up wasting years of our time and missing all those heaven-sent opportunities. We might not think that we have the time to live our lives any differently from the way we do now, but with the right kind of planning we can transform who we are and what we do and still manage to fit in the day job.

We hear a lot in the news of disasters around the world. Men women and children across the globe have lost their lives unexpectedly and prematurely. Death comes like a thief in the night just as it did in the days of Noah, and just as in the days of Noah, we must keep focussed and live in perpetual readiness. Jesus doesn't tell us this to frighten us but to encourage us to take responsibility for the here and now.

Saint Nicholas (6 December)

The true story of Santa Claus begins with Saint Nicholas, who was born during the third century in the village of Patara. Taking to heart Jesus' words to "sell what you own and give the money to the poor," Nicholas used his whole inheritance to assist the needy, the sick, and the suffering. He dedicated his life to serving God and was made Bishop of Myra while still a young man. Bishop Nicholas became known throughout the land for his generosity to those in need, his love for children, and his concern for sailors and ships.

Canon Christopher reflects several programmes on antiques and auctions have been broadcast on television in recent months. The value of the objects cover a wide range. Recently, it was reported that a gold watch owned by a victim of the Titanic sea disaster at the beginning of the last century raised well over 1 million pounds. Antique shops often display very small items such as pendants showing pictures that were treasures to the owners and no-one else. Some time ago I was given a framed photograph of pupils and staff that was taken at Upholland College. I was told it was found in an antiques shop, and I was in the photograph. It meant something to another person whom I knew but in clearing his house it had been thrown away. It is now hanging on the wall in my room for me to remember.

About two or three years ago my sister and I (as executors for two elderly relatives who had no immediate family) had the thankless task of emptying and then selling their house. There was an accumulation of possessions spanning ninety years. Many things were distributed to charities but there are still items that needed to be somehow disposed of. They give evidence of memories which do not necessarily mean anything to us such as photographs of people not known to us who, we pray, have now been joined by this elderly couple in the next life. What do we do with their wedding photographs and historic events meaningful only to the couple? Sometimes when I have visited homes, usually on sick calls, I have expressed my envy of the ability of people to have perfectly tidy rooms with nothing out of place. Have they hidden everything away or do they not keep anything? One of my weaknesses is the unwillingness to throw things away because "they may be useful". It is hard to destroy one's memories especially of happy times. Items include letters and cards from people who are now long-gone.

Some memories are always with us. I trust that above all else, at the centre of our lives is the memory of what Jesus means to us and does for us now. Every day I use His words ... "Do this in memory of me". We welcome Him into our presence, remember him and learn from Him
