Gospel Reflection - Cast in Stone

Our identity is shaped by the people we live
and work with. Our identity is shaped by how
we deal with family and workplace relationships over a space
of many years. As a child, loved and cherished, we become
strong confident and assertive. As a child who is not loved, we
become insecure, secretive and even delinquent. As a spouse
or parent, we can become caring supportive and strong, or we
can become embittered, devious, angry or fearful.. As an
employer or an employee we can become cooperative or
competitive, kind or ruthless, sharing or greedy. Before we
know it our identity is cast in stone, and others routinely refer
to us as a nag, a bully, bossy, henpecked, stubborn or
spineless. If we are very lucky people might label us as 'the
salt of the earth' or 'a rock'.

Today Jesus looks at Peter and says, "You will be called
Cephas". Jesus sees him as a 'rock'. How his friends must have
rolled round laughing. Peter? A rock? Peter was impetuous,
naïve and not always the most trusting of Jesus' disciples. If
Peter was a rock he was a very crumbly one! Interestingly,
slowly but surely, Peter grows into the rock Jesus believes him
to be. We are being taught something very important. Peter's
identity is very much rooted in his relationship with Jesus.

We might look at our own Identity and not like what we have
become. We might wish we could be different but feel trapped
by circumstance, or expectation. The good news is that by
working on our relationship with God, we can become the
people we always knew we could be.

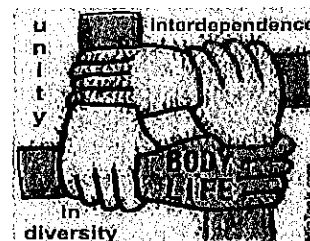

St Oscar Romero – "In Mary we are always referred to Christ. Mary is the sign of Christ's presence. That is why, sisters and brothers, when we say that Mary is the mother of the Church, we are also saying that the Church and Mary are a sign of Christ's presence. If the Church saves, it is because she prolongs the saving mission of Christ. If Mary is the source of inspiration and love in our prayers, it is because she makes visible the power, the tenderness, the redemption of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Mary is the sign of Christ's presence. Let us not forget it". (Homily: 1 January 1978).

Canon Christopher reflects This weekend, in England and Wales, we celebrate Peace Sunday. There are other days too when it is only right that peace in the world is drawn to our attention. On New Year's Day, for example, we look forward with prayer and hope for Peace throughout the world for the months ahead. It is clear from the present world situation that prayer for peace should be foremost in our minds.

I have been reading a book recently about Saint Oscar Romero. You may have seen the picture of this saint in our churches and in the Cathedral. He was an Archbishop in South America at the time of great conflict in El Salvador. He was a humble gentleman who was called upon to lead the people in that country during a time of national crisis during the last century. In spite of threats and opposition from the powers that be in that country, he was willing to die for what he believed. He had great devotion to the rosary and our Blessed Lady where he found his great strength.

On 24 March 1980 while celebrating holy Mass, Bishop Romero was assassinated aged 62. He was a marked man in hatred of the faith, not as a soldier or a politician but a prophetic shepherd. In faithfulness to Christ and his gospel Romero could not remain silent while his own people faced repression, torture and murder. His death provoked outrage and condemnation around the world. He was canonised by Pope Francis in 2018 as a champion of God-given human dignity.

In relation to that my own thoughts turn to a young man from this parish who, for fifteen years, served as a priest in El Salvador not long after this event. When on holiday, Fr Gerard Postlethwaite who was visiting his mother, Josie, used to supply for me as I took the opportunity to have a few days away. As a Benedictine, he had the name of Basil as member of the community of Ampleforth. Sadly, Fr Gerard died suddenly in 2017 whilst walking the Camino to Santiago de Compostella leading a pilgrimage of young people.

There are many others who have stories to relate about their experiences of injustice in our troubled world, but who have had the courage to face up to it as did Oscar Romero. What was happening before their eyes, to the weakest and the poorest, was happening to Christ and to his afflicted body, the Church.

Let us continue to pray for them. Amen. *Mary, Queen of Peace, pray for us.*

Saints for the Week

19 January : St Wulstan, Bishop (1008-1095). Born in Warwickshire he became a Benedictine monk. In 1062 he was appointed Bishop and was one of the few Anglo-Saxons in high office to survive the Norman Conquest. He was renowned as a 'confessor' for his care of the poor and sick and for the high standards he demanded of his clergy.

20 January : St Fabian, Pope (c3). A noble Roman by birth he was chosen to be Bishop of Rome in the year 250. He was crowned with martyrdom (as St Cyprian testified). Buried in the Catacombs of Callixtus (which he worked to develop) and later reinterred in San Sebastian.

20 January : St Sebastian, Martyr (c255-288). Sebastian was a Roman soldier who secretly encouraged imprisoned Christians and attracted converts for which he suffered martyrdom.

21 January : St Agnes, Virgin and Martyr (c291-304). Suffered martyrdom at the age of 13 as a noble Roman girl who refused to deny her Christian faith. Lambs are traditionally blessed in her honour on this day in Rome and their wool is used to make the pallia for new archbishops.

22 January : St Vincent, Deacon and Martyr (c3-304). A deacon of the church of Zaragoza and the protomartyr of Spain. He suffered terrible torture and died the death of a martyr at Valencia. He was roasted on a gridiron for refusing the Roman governor's command to burn the scriptures. His veneration quickly spread throughout the Western and Eastern church.

24 January : St. Francis de Sales (1567-1622) : Francis de Sales took seriously the words of Christ, "Learn of me for I am meek and humble of heart." As he said himself, it took him 20 years to conquer his quick temper, but no one ever suspected he had such a problem, so overflowing with good nature and kindness was his usual manner of acting. His perennial meekness and sunny disposition won for him the title of "Gentleman Saint."
