Gospel Reflection - Think Again!

Today we listen to Jesus' most famous sermon; a list of promises to the poor, the meek and the merciful that we now call 'The Beatitudes'. "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven," promises Jesus, "Blessed are the meek, blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness."



Is Jesus telling us we can only be blessed if we make ourselves poor? Is he telling us to sit back meekly and let others walk all over us?

Is Jesus encouraging us to go out and actively invite persecution and insult?

It's difficult to embrace Jesus' values because we have been brought up to value everything that Jesus does not. From an early age we have been taught to work hard at school so that we will get a good job and earn lots of money. We are scolded for not speaking up for ourselves and applauded for pushing ourselves forward. Our culture is all about winning, prestige and material success.

The challenge we find in the Beatitudes is to work contrary to our human instincts in order to find true happiness and fulfilment. Our instincts are to amass wealth, earn fame, and bask in our perceived self-importance. It is often our cowardly instinct to turn a blind eye to injustice or to fail to stand up for what we believe because we are afraid of ridicule. It is the instinct of governments to engage in conflict in the pursuit of material gain and power.

In his sermon, Jesus was not suggesting we live in dire poverty or become human doormats for the sake of it. Rather Jesus is asking us to look again at our values. We are asked to look at the things that we think will bring happiness. Jesus challenges us to think again.

World Day for Consecrated Life (2 February)

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a Day of Prayer for Women and Men in Consecrated Life.

This celebration is attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on 2 February. This Feast is also known as Candlemas Day; the day on which candles are blessed symbolising Christ who is the light of the world. So too, those in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples.

Although the World Day for Consecrated Life is celebrated on 2 February, it is also celebrated on the following Sunday in order to highlight the gift of consecrated persons for the whole Church.

Please pray for all those who have made commitments in the consecrated life.

Presentation of the Lord (2 February)

Simeon had waited all his life to see Jesus. The Holy Spirit had promised him that he would live long enough. When Mary and Joseph presented the baby at the temple, Simeon said, "Now, Lord, you have kept your promise, and you may let your servant go in peace. With my own eyes, I have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples."

Seeing Jesus satisfied Simon's life. We are prompted to ask what would satisfy us in our lives. Are the goals we set worth a lifetime of wanting, as Simeon's was?

Canon Christopher reflects You may be inclined to say and agree with the phrase that "Times they are a-changing". It applies to many levels of society. Elderly people use it more often as they like remember 'the good old days'.

At this time of year we usually receive an invitation from the town hall to give the annual information about our parish and school participation that is required to prepare for walking day. The reaction is always to say, 'what's the hurry' as it does not take place for another six months. However, as with many big events in life people do not realise the work that goes on behind the scenes. Things don't just happen without people taking responsibility and to make them happen.

This week with several representatives from the parish and the school I attended such a meeting at the Town Hall. Usually there is a poor response to this invitation, but this year, the numbers attending reflected the awareness that there is a threat to Walking Day taking place. We cannot deny that times have changed and so has the community in the town. For many people there is little understanding of the importance and meaning of it since they have not grown up here.

We were made aware at the meeting that the event is very expensive to the Council budget for the year being in the region of many thousands of pounds so that money for other important needs will not be available. Security and safety for the participants is vital and made clear in the light of recent events in other towns when lives were put in danger due to the behaviour of people who seem to have no respect for life. This is very expensive and the support of the police which has effectively been withdrawn, and being no longer available the protection must be secured, hired and paid for. 'There is nothing cheap these days'.

Suffice it to say at this stage, questions are being asked as to whether Walking Day should go ahead or at least take on a different format. In the light of its origin about 140 years ago, it is principally a witness to the Christian Faith but as times have now changed, perhaps there is need to do this in a different way. A Steering Group that will meet in a few days' time, has been set up led by the Rector of Saint Elphin's to look to the future.

On another thoughts, you have already been made aware of other changes that are taking place within the Archdiocese and especially in the parishes of our deanery. I hope you read and absorbed what Archbishop John said in his message to us a couple of week ago. Inevitable changes cannot be ignored since they will affect all of us in some way or other. We are part of a pilot scheme and are now undergoing an audit of the parishes, that is, we are looking at what we have and what we are.

At Masses this weekend, you are asked to take a copy of a questionnaire to get an impression of what people think of each of our churches/parishes. **We ask that you return your responses to the church next weekend.** Please see further reference to this below.

In conclusion, I am very grateful to those who do so much to support us in so many different ways as well as helping in this process. However, I do ask for more involvement, and I will be asking people to help. Among the community there are many talented people with opinions and skills which should be shared. When the Archbishop visits us in the few weeks' time, he will be asking groups of people what we have achieved and we need to be able to tell him. Let us be aware that the Lord is with us always in our endeavours to build up the Church now and in the future. Amen.
